COURSE DESCRIPTION: (3 semester hours)

A survey of the styles and forms of music as it developed from the Middle Ages to the present. This course will familiarize the student with cultural context, terminology, genres, and notation.

FORMAT: Traditional, face-to-face with digital/online supplements

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

1. Identify the major periods of music history, general style characteristics and genres of each period, and major composers of each period and representative works
2. Articulate the relationship between historical developments and events with musical styles and aesthetics.
3. Critically evaluate musical works using specific terminology and listening skills

CORE CURRICULUM COMPONENT:

The purpose of the Creative Arts component in the core curriculum is to provide the student the opportunity to develop an appreciation for the arts through an analysis of creative artifacts and works of the human imagination. This will involve the synthesis and interpretation of artistic expression and enable critical, creative, and innovative communication about works of art.

CORE OBJECTIVES:

1. Communication Skills: Effective development, interpretation, and expression of ideas through written, oral, and visual communication (To be assessed via written essays and oral presentations)
2. Critical Thinking: creative thinking, innovation, inquiry, and analysis; evaluation and synthesis of information (To be assessed through exams and listening assessments in which students will identify and categorize compositions from a variety of composers, historical periods, and genres)
3. Social Responsibility: intercultural competence, knowledge of civic responsibility, and the ability to engage effectively in regional, national, and global communities (To be assessed via concert attendance projects, written and oral responses)
4. Teamwork: ability to consider different points of view and to work effectively with others to support a shared purpose or goal (To be assessed via group concert programming project and other collaborative activities)
